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Rotary Veterans Initiative Invests \$25,000 in the Career Dreams of Penn State Harrisburg Student Veterans and supports the Douglas W. Pollock Center for Addiction Outreach and Research

Carlisle, PA. – The Rotary Veterans Initiative (RVI), Penn State Harrisburg, and Douglas W. Pollock Center for Addiction Outreach and Research are collaborating to help military veterans transform their lives, support their families, strengthen our Central PA communities, and address the complex societal problem of addiction.
